DIRECTIONS TO STG

From North – Take 29S Bypass. Exit RT onto Hwy 58E toward South Boston. Take first RT onto River Point Rd. Turn LT onto Slayton Ave. at the Cyber Park sign.

From South – Take 29N Bypass. Exit RT onto Hwy 58E toward South Boston. Turn RT onto River Point Rd. (by the Pilot gas station). Turn LT onto Slayton Ave. at the Cyber Park sign.

From East – From South Boston on Hwy 58W, take a LT at the Pilot gas station before you get to Danville. This is River Point Rd. Take another LT onto Slayton Ave. at the Cyber Park sign.

From West – Take Hwy 58E toward Greensboro/ South Boston. This will take you around Danville. Stay on Hwy 58E/ Hwy 29N toward South Boston/Lynchburg. Exit RT onto Hwy 58E toward South Boston. Take first RT onto River Point Rd. Turn LT onto Slayton Ave. at the Cyber Park sign.

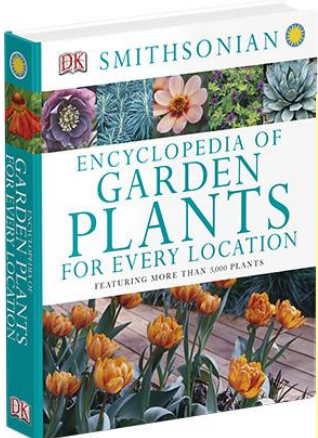
Joe Murray is certified as an arborist, utility arborist, and Tree Risk Assessment Qualification instructor. Formerly a college biology professor, he is currently a trainer for the Mid-Atlantic chapter of the International Society of Arboriculture (ISA) and an independent consulting arborist for Tree Literacy, LLC. Joe obtained his Bachelor of Arts degree in Biology from Radford University, Master of Science in Plant Pathology from Virginia Tech, and Master in Teaching from the University of Richmond. When Joe is not hiking, participating in Blue Ridge Mountain research projects, or managing his Bath County Virginia farm's soil health (learn more at <https://7acewoodfarm.com>), he is lecturing throughout the USA as a tree biology educator. Joe will make two presentations: "Trees and Turf: An Antagonist Relationship", and "Progressive Horticulture: Rediscovering the Wisdom of Our Ancestors".



James Gagliardi has loved gardening his entire life. He earned his Bachelor of Science degree in Horticulture from the University of Connecticut and then Master in Public Horticulture through the University of Delaware's Longwood Graduate Program. After college, he became a Horticulturist at the American Horticultural Society's River Farm (Alexandria, VA). Currently he is Lead Horticulturist with the Smithsonian Gardens in Washington, DC. He is responsible for year-round garden care and design for seasonal and permanent plantings surrounding the National Museum of History, including the Pollinator Garden and Urban Bird Habitat. James edited the Smithsonian's first gardening book, *Encyclopedia of Garden Plants for Every Location*. He will present "Creating Beautiful Landscapes for Pollinator and Wildlife Habitat: Smithsonian Gardens to Your Front Yard".
