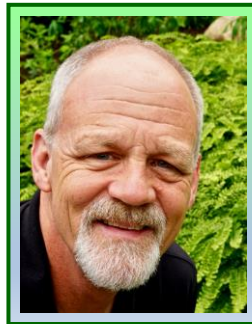

# OUR SPEAKERS *for* 2019

## DAN BENARCIK is new to Spring to Green!

Dan started work for Chanticleer Garden in Wayne, PA in 1993. The garden was then in its infancy, and it was amazing to watch it grow. Unlike many public gardens that seek to educate through plant labels and collections, Chanticleer is about innovation. The horticulturists there are artists, as well, and are encouraged to explore their ideas through travel and continuing education. Dan oversees the Courtyard Gardens where tropical, sub-tropical, and tender perennials for seasonal display are emphasized. Dan's position at Chanticleer affords him the privilege of creating and maintaining first and last impressions of the garden for visitors. Dan also manages the woodshed at the garden, where staff create furniture and furnishings for the garden from lumber most often felled within the garden.

Dan will advise those with limited space or limited time through his presentation **Containers, Pots with Purpose: The Exciting World of Container Culture**, a look across the breadth of container gardening styles and techniques. Different types of containers will be discussed, as well as some favorite plants for container culture.



## BRYCE LANE, a Spring to Green favorite, is back!

As a teen working at a local gardening center, Bryce discovered his passion for plants and telling others about them. After earning his BS and MS in Horticulture, he became a Lecturer in the Department of Horticultural Science at NC State University. He spent 34 years teaching and advising over 20,000 students. For 11 seasons he hosted and produced the three-time Emmy-winning UNCTV public television show "In the Garden with Bryce Lane". Bryce retired in 2014, but still teaches part-time in the department and speaks frequently at gardening workshops and symposia. An avid gardener, Bryce has gardened on the same one-quarter-acre plot for 35 years. He and his wife of 41 years also spend plenty of time with their 6 grandchildren!

Bryce will kick off the day with **Gardening for Well-Seasoned Gardeners: Plants and Practices for an Aging Generation**. Bryce will offer baby boomers ways to more easily fulfill their gardening desires. From plants, to tools, to design, this talk will focus on techniques that make it easier to create and care for outdoor living spaces without breaking our backs! Bryce will end the afternoon with **The Power of Plants: How Gardening Teaches, Inspires, and Encourages Children**. Gardeners can help children grow up well by sharing their passion for gardening. Gardening can be used to teach children many essential concepts and principles. Schools use gardens to do just that. Hear how you can share your love for gardening with children so that they are informed, inspired, and motivated to become life-long gardeners!
